Ontario Investing in Francophone Communities in Stormont-Dundas-South Glengarry

[CORNWALL] — The Ontario government is investing in Stormont-Dundas-South Glengarry to help support the development and vitality of its local Francophone community.

Through the Francophone Community Grants Program, 48 organizations and businesses across Ontario will receive a total of \$ 1 million in funding for cultural, community and commercial initiatives.

In the Stormont-Dundas-South Glengarry, total funding of \$61,877 was granted to the following projects:

- “L’humour fête la francophonie dans toute sa splendeur et sa diversité! (The comedy world celebrates the Francophonie in all its splendour and diversity!)”, led by **Association canadienne français de l’Ontario – Stormont, Dundas et Glengarry** (\$25,000)
- “Des aînés plus branchés et moins isolés (Helping seniors become more connected and less isolated)”, led by Centre Charles-Émile Claude, centre polyvalent des aîné(e)s inc. (\$21,135)
- “Formation professionnelle continue pour les partenaires communautaires et régionaux qui travaillent de concert pour le mieux-être et la santé mentale des enfants, jeunes et familles francophones de l’Est Ontarien (Continuing professional development for community and regional partners working together for the well-being and mental health of Francophone children, youth and families in Eastern Ontario)”, led by L’Equipe d’hygiène mentale pour francophones de S.D. & G. Inc. (\$15,742)
